The book of Psalms.

Psalm 1.

Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful. 2 but his delight is in the law of the lord: & in his law doth he meditate day & night. 3 & he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; whatsoever he doeth shall prosper. 4 the ungodly are not so: but are like the chaff which the wind driveth away. 5 therefore the ungodly shall not stand in the judgement, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous. 6 for the lord knoweth the way of the righteous: but the way of the ungodly shall perish.

Psalm 2.

Why do the heathen rage, & the people imagine a vain thing? 2 the kings of the earth set themselves, & the rulers take counsel together, against the lord, & against his anointed, saying, 3 let us break their bands asunder, & cast away their cords from us. 4 he that sitteth in the heavens shall laugh: the lord shall have them in derision. 5 then shall he speak unto them in his wrath, & vex them in his sore displeasure. 6 Yet have I set my king upon my holy hill of zion. 7 I will declare the decree: the lord hath said unto me, thou art my son; this day have I begotten thee. 8 ask of me, & I shall give thee the heathen for thine inheritance, & the uttermost

upon the earth, & lay mine honor in the dust. 2 O arise, o lord, in thine anger, lift up thyself because of the rage of mine enemies: & awake for me to the judgment that thou hast commanded. 3 so shall the congregation of the people compass thee about; for their sakes therefore return thou on high. 4 the lord shall judge the people: judge me, o lord, according to my righteousness, & according to mine integrity that is in me. 5 o let the wickedness of the wicked come to an end; but establish the just: for the righteous God trieth the hearts & reins. 6 my defence is of God, which saveth the upright in heart. 7 God judgeth the righteous, & God is angry with the wicked every day. 8 if he turn not, he will whet his sword; he hath bent his bow, & made it ready. 9 he hath also prepared for him the instruments of death; he ordaineth his arrows against the persecutors. 10 behold, he travaileth with iniquity, & hath conceived mischief, & brought forth falsehood. 11 he made a pit, & digged it, & is fallen into the ditch which he made. 12 his mischief shall return upon his own head, & his violent dealing shall come down upon his own pate. 13 i will praise the lord according to his righteousness: & will sing praise to the name of the lord most high.

Psalm 8.

o lord our lord, how excellent is thy name in all the earth! who hast set thy glory above the heavens. 2 out of the mouth of babes & sucklings hast thou ordained strength because of thine enemies, that thou mightest still the enemy & the avenger. 3 when i consider thy heavens, the work of thy fingers,

doings; 12 when he maketh inquisition for blood, he remembereth them: he forgetteth not the cry of the humble. 13 have mercy upon me, o lord: consider my trouble which i suffer of them that hate me, thou that liftest me up from the gates of death: 14 that i may show forth all thy praise in the gates of the daughter of zion: i will rejoyce in thy salvation. 15 the heathen are sunk down in the pit that they made: in the net which they hid is their own foot taken. 16 the lord is known by the judgement which he executeth: the wicked is snared in the work of his own hands. *higgaion. selah.* 17 the wicked shall be turned into hell, & all the nations that forget god. 18 for the needy shall not always be forgotten: the expectation of the poor shall not perish forever. 19 arise, o lord; let not man prevail: let the heathen be judged in thy sight. 20 put them in fear, o lord: that the nations may know themselves to be but men. *selah.*

Psalm 10.

why standest thou afar off, o lord? why hidest thou thyself in times of trouble? 2 the wicked in his pride doth persecute the poor: let them be taken in the devices that they have imagined. 3 for the wicked boasteth of his heart's desire, & blesseth the covetous whom the lord abhorreth. 4 the wicked, through the pride of his countenance, will not seek after god: god is not in all his thoughts. 5 his ways are always grievous; thy judgments are far above out of his sight: as for all his enemies he puffeth at them. 6 he hath said in his heart i shall not be moved: for i shall never be in adversity. 7 his mouth is full of cursing & deceit & fraud:

his eyes behold, his eyelids try the children of men.
 5 the lord trieth the righteous: but the wicked of
 him that loveth violence his soul hateth. 6 upon
 the wicked he shall cast snares, fire & brimstone, &
 a horrible tempest: this shall be the portion of their
 cup. 7 for the righteous lord loveth righteous-
 ness; his countenance doth behold the upright.

Psalm 12.

help, lord; for the godly man ceaseth; for the
 faithful fail from among the children of men. 2
 they speak vanity every one with his neighbor: with
 flattering lips & with a double heart do they speak.
 3 the lord shall cut off all flattering lips, & the
 tongue that speaketh proud things: 4 who have
 said, with our tongue will we prevail; our lips are
 our own: who is lord over us? 5 for the oppres-
 sion of the poor, for the sighing of the needy, now
 will i arise, saith the lord; i will set him in safety
 from him that puffeth at him. 6 the words of the
 lord are pure words: as silver tried in a furnace of
 earth purified seven times. 7 thou shalt keep
 them, o lord, thou shalt preserve them from this
 generation for ever. 8 the wicked walk on every
 side, when the vilest men are exalted.

Psalm 13.

how long wilt thou forget me, o lord? for ever?
 how long wilt thou hide thy face from me? 2 how
 long shall i take counsel in my soul, having sorrow
 in my heart daily? how long shall mine enemy be ex-
 alted over me? 3 consider & hear me, o lord my
 god: lighten mine eyes, lest i sleep the sleep of
 death; 4 lest mine enemy say, i have prevailed
 against him; & those that trouble me rejoice when i

am moved. 5 but i have trusted in thy mercy; my heart shall rejoyce in thy salvation. 6 i will sing unto the lord, because he hath dealt bountifully with me.

Psalm 14.

The fool hath said in his heart, there is no god. they are corrupt, they have done abominable works, there is none that doeth good. 2 the lord looked down from heaven upon the children of men, to see if there were any that did understand, & seek god. 3 they are all gone aside, they are all together become filthy: there is none that doeth good, no, not one. 4 have all the workers of iniquity no knowledge? who eat up my people as they eat bread, & call not upon the lord. 5 there were they in great fear: for god is in the generation of the righteous. 6 ye have shamed the counsel of the poor, because the lord is his refuge. 7 oh that the salvation of israel were come out of zion! when the lord bringeth back the captivity of his people, Jacob shall rejoyce, & israel shall be glad.

Psalm 15.

Lord, who shall abide in thy tabernacle? who shall dwell in thy holy hill? 2 he that walketh uprightly, & worketh righteousness, & speaketh the truth in his heart. 3 he that backbiteth not with his tongue, nor doeth evil to his neighbor, nor taketh up a reproach against his neighbor. 4 in whose eyes a vile person is contemned; but he honoureth them that fear the lord. he that sweareth to his own hurt, & changeth not. 5 he that putteth not out his money to usury, nor taketh reward against the

of death compassed me, & the floods of ungodly men made me afraid. 5 The sorrows of hell compassed me about: the snares of death prevented me. 6 In my distress I called upon the Lord, & cried unto my God: he heard my voice out of his temple, & my cry came before him, even into his ears. 7 Then the earth shook & trembled; the foundations also of the hills moved & were shaken, because he was wroth. 8 There went up a smoke out of his nostrils, & fire out of his mouth devoured; coals were kindled by it. 9 He bowed the heavens also, & came down, & darkness was under his feet. 10 & he rode upon a cherub & did fly: Yea, he did fly upon the wings of the wind. 11 He made darkness his secret place; his pavilion round about him were dark waters & thick clouds of the skies. 12 At the brightness that was before him his thick clouds passed, hail-stones & coals of fire. 13 The Lord also thundered in the heavens, & the highest gave his voice; hail-stones & coals of fire. 14 Yea, he sent out his arrows, & scattered them; & he shot out lightnings, & discomfited them. 15 Then the channels of waters were seen, & the foundations of the world were discovered at thy rebuke, O Lord, at the blast of the breath of thy nostrils. 16 He sent from above, he took me, he drew me out of many waters. 17 He delivered me from my strong enemy, & from them which hated me: for they were too strong for me. 18 They prevented me in the day of my calamity: but the Lord was my stay. 19 He brought me forth also into a large place: he delivered me, because he delighteth in me. 20 The Lord rewarded me according to my righteousness; ac-

Psalm 23.

The lord is my shepherd; i shall not want. 2 he maketh me to lie down in green Pastures; he leadeth me beside the still waters. 3 he restoreth my soul; he leadeth me in the Paths of righteousness for his name's sake. 4 Yea, though i walk through the valley of the shadow of death, i will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod & thy staff they comfort me. 5 thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over. 6 surely goodness & mercy shall follow me all the days of my life; & i will dwell in the house of the lord for ever.

Psalm 24.

The earth is the lord's & the fulness thereof; the world, & they that dwell therein. 2 for he hath founded it upon the seas, & established it upon the floods. 3 who shall ascend into the hill of the lord? & who shall stand in his holy Place? 4 he that hath clean hands, & a Pure heart; who hath not lifted up his soul unto vanity, nor sworn deceitfully. 5 he shall receive the blessing from the lord, & righteousness from the god of his salvation. 6 this is the generation of them that seek him, that seek thy face, o Jacob. selah. 7 lift up Your heads, o Ye gates; & be Ye lift up, Ye everlasting doors; & the king of glory shall come in. 8 who is this king of glory? the lord strong, & mighty, the lord mighty in battle. 9 lift up Your heads, o Ye gates; even lift them up, Ye everlasting doors; & the king of glory shall come in. 10 who is this king of glory? the lord of hosts, he is the king of glory. selah.

Psalm 26.

Judge me, o lord; for i have walked in mine integrity: i have trusted also in the lord; therefore i shall not slide. — 2 examine me, o lord, & Prove me; try my reins & my heart. — 3 for thy loving-kindness is before mine eyes: & i have walked in thy truth, & i have not sat with vain Persons, neither will i go in with dissemblers. — 5 i have hated the congregation of evil doers; & will not sit with the wicked. — 6 i will wash my hands in innocency: so will i compass thine altar, o lord: — 7 that i may Publish with the voice of thanksgiving, & tell of all thy wondrous works. — 8 lord, i have loved the habitation of thy house, & the Place where thine honor dwelleth. — 9 gather not my soul with sinners, nor my life with bloody men: — 10 in whose hands is mischief, & their right hand is full of bribes. — 11 but as for me, i will walk in mine integrity: redeem me, & be merciful unto me. — 12 my foot standeth in an even Place: in the congregations will i bless the lord.

Psalm 27.

The lord is my light & my salvation; whom shall i fear? the lord is the strength of my life; of whom shall i be afraid? — 2 when the wicked, even mine enemies & my foes, came upon me to eat up my flesh, they stumbled & fell. — 3 though a host should encamp against me, my heart shall not fear: though war should rise against me, in this will i be confident. — 4 one thing have i desired of the lord, that will i seek after; that i may dwell in the house of the lord all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the lord, & to inquire in his temple. — 5 for in the time of

1 O Lord my God, thou hast not made my foes to rejoice over me. 2 O Lord my God, I cried unto thee, & thou hast healed me. 3 O Lord, thou hast brought up my soul from the grave: thou hast kept me alive, that I should not go down to the pit. 4 Sing unto the Lord; O ye saints of his, & give thanks at the remembrance of his holiness. 5 For his anger endureth but a moment; in his favor is life: weeping may endure for a night, but joy cometh in the morning. 6 & as in my prosperity I said, I shall never be moved. 7 Lord by thy favor thou hast made my mountain to stand strong: thou didst hide thy face, & I was troubled. 8 I cried to thee O Lord; & unto the Lord I made supplication. 9 What profit is there in my blood, when I go down to the pit? shall the dust praise thee? shall it declare thy truth? 10 Hear, O Lord, & have mercy upon me: Lord, be thou my helper. 11 Thou hast turned for me my mourning into dancing: thou hast put off my sackcloth & girded me with gladness; 12 To the end that my glory may sing praise to thee, & not be silent. O Lord my God, I will give thanks unto thee for ever.

Psalm 31.

1 In thee, O Lord, do I put my trust; let me never be ashamed: deliver me in thy righteousness. 2 Bow down thine ear; deliver me speedily: be thou my strong rock, for a house of defence to save me. 3 For thou art my rock & my fortress; therefore for thy name's sake lead me, & guide me. 4 Pull me out of the net that they have laid privily for me: for thou art my strength. 5 Into thy hand I commit my spirit: thou hast redeemed me, O Lord God of truth. 6 I have hated them that regard lying van-

hath showed me his marvellous kindness in a strong city. 22 for i said in my haste, i am cut off from before thine eyes; nevertheless thou heardest the voice of my supplications when i cried unto thee. 23 o love the lord, all ye his saints: for the lord preserveth the faithful, & plentifully rewardeth the proud loer. 24. be of good courage, & he shall strengthen your heart, all ye that hope in the lord.

Psalm 32.

blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered. 2 blessed is the man unto whom the lord imputeth not iniquity, & in whose spirit there is no guile. 3 when i kept silence, my bones waxed old through my roaring all the day long. 4 for day & night thy hand was heavy upon me: my moisture is turned into the drought of summer. selah. 5 i acknowledged my sin unto thee, & mine iniquity have i not hid. i said, i will confess my transgressions unto the lord; & thou forgavest the iniquity of my sin. selah. 6 for this shall every one that is godly pray unto thee in a time when thou mayest be found: surely in the floods of great waters they shall not come nigh unto him. 7 thou art my hiding place; thou shalt preserve me from trouble; thou shalt compass me about with songs of deliverance. selah. 8 i will instruct thee, & teach thee in the way which thou shalt go: i will guide thee with mine eye. 9 be ye not as the horse, or as the mule, which have no understanding: whose mouth must be held in with bit & bridle, lest they come near unto thee. 10 many sorrows shall be to the wicked: but he that trusteth in the lord, mercy shall compass him about. 11

them that do evil, to cut off the remembrance of them from the earth. 17 the righteous cry, & the lord heareth, & delivereth them out of all their troubles. 18 the lord is high unto them that are of a broken heart; & saveth such as be of a contrite spirit. 19 many are the afflictions of the righteous: but the lord delivereth them out of them all. 20 he keepeth all his bones: not one of them is broken. 21 evil shall slay the wicked: & they that hate the righteous shall be desolate. 22 the lord redeemeth the soul of his servants: & none of them that trust in him shall be desolate.

Psalm 35.

plead my cause, o lord, with them that strive with me: fight against them that fight against me. 2 take hold of shield & buckler, & stand up for my help. 3 draw out also the spear, & stop the way against them that persecute me: say unto my soul, I am thy salvation. 4 let them be confounded & put to shame that seek after my soul: let them be turned back & brought to confusion that devise my hurt. 5 let them be as chaff before the wind: & let the angel of the lord chase them. 6 let their way be dark & slippery: & let the angel of the lord persecute them. 7 for without cause have they hid for me their net in a pit; which without cause they have digged for my soul. 8 let destruction come upon him at unawares; & let his net that he hath hid catch himself: into that very destruction let him fall. 9 & my soul shall be joyful in the lord: it shall rejoice in his salvation. 10 all my bones shall say, lord, who is like unto thee, which deliverest the poor from him that is too strong for him.

holdeth the righteous. 18 the lord knoweth the days of the upright: & their inheritance shall be forever. 19 they shall not be ashamed in the evil time: & in the days of famine they shall be satisfied. 20 but the wicked shall perish, & the enemies of the lord shall be as the fat of lambs; they shall consume; into smoke shall they consume away. 21 the wicked borroweth, & payeth not again; but the righteous showeth mercy & giveth. 22 for such as be blessed of him shall inherit the earth; & they that be cursed of him shall be cut off. 23 the steps of a good man are ordered by the lord: & he delighteth in his way. 24 though he fall, he shall not be utterly cast down: for the lord upholdeth him with his hand. 25 i have been young, & now am old; yet have i not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed bearing bread. 26 he is ever merciful, & lendeth, & his seed is blessed. 27 depart from evil, & do good; & dwell forevermore. 28 for the lord loveth judgement, & forsaketh not his saints: they are preserved for ever: but the seed of the wicked shall be cut off. 29 the righteous shall inherit the land, & dwell therein forever. 30 the mouth of the righteous speaketh wisdom, & his tongue talketh of judgement. 31 the law of his god is in his heart; none of his steps shall slide. 32 the wicked watcheth the righteous, & seeketh to slay him. 33 the lord will not leave him in his hand, nor condemn him when he is judged. 34 wait on the lord, & keep his way, & he shall exalt thee to inherit the land: when the wicked are cut off, thou shalt see it. 35 i have seen the wicked in great power, & spreading himself like a green bay-

tree. 36 Yet he passed away, & lo, he was not:
 Yea, I sought him, but he could not be found. 37
 Mark the perfect man, & behold the upright: for
 the end of that man is peace. 38 but the trans-
 gressors shall be destroyed together: the end of the
 wicked shall be cut off. 39 but the salvation of
 the righteous is of the lord: he is their strength in the
 time of trouble. 40 & the lord shall help them, &
 deliver them: he shall deliver them from the wicked,
 & save them, because they trust in him.

Psalm 38.

O lord, rebuke me not in thy wrath: neither chasten
 me in thy hot displeasure. 2 for thine arrows
 stick fast in me, & thy hand presseth me sore. 3
 there is no soundness in my flesh because of thine
 anger; neither is there any rest in my bones because
 of my sin. 4 for mine iniquities are gone over my
 head: as a heavy burden they are too heavy for me.
 5 my wounds stink, & are corrupt because of my
 foolishness. 6 I am troubled; I am bowed down
 greatly; I go mourning all the day long. 7 for
 my loins are filled with a loathsome disease: & there
 is no soundness in my flesh. 8 I am feeble & sore
 broken: I have roared by reason of the displeasure
 of my heart. 9 lord, all my desire is before thee;
 & my groaning is not hid from thee. 10 my heart
 panteth, my strength faileth me: as for the light of
 mine eyes, it also is gone from me. 11 my lovers
 & my friends stand aloof from my sore; & my kins-
 men stand afar off. 12 they also that seek after
 my life lay snares for me: & they that seek my hurt
 speak mischievous things, & imagine deceits all the
 day long. 13 but I, as a deaf man, heard not; &

i was as a dumb man that openeth not his mouth.
 14 thus i was as a man that heareth not, & in whose
 mouth are no reproofs. 15 for in thee, o lord,
 do i hope: thou wilt hear, o lord my god. 16 for
 i said, hear me, lest otherwise they should rejoice
 over me: when my foot slippeth, they magnify them-
 selves against me. 17 for i am ready to halt, &
 my sorrow is continually before me. 18 for i will
 declare mine iniquity; i will be sorry for my sin.
 19 but mine enemies are lively, & they are strong:
 & they that hate me wrongfully are multiplied.
 20 they also that render evil for good are mine ad-
 versaries; because i follow the thing that good is.
 21 forsake me not, o lord: o my god, be not far
 from me. 22 make haste to help me, o lord my sal-
 vation.

Psalm 39.

i said, i will take heed to my ways, that i sin not
 with my tongue: i will keep my mouth with a bridle,
 while the wicked is before me. 2 i was dumb with
 silence; i held my peace, even from good; & my
 sorrow was stirred. 3 my heart was hot within
 me; while i was musing the fire burned: then spake i
 with my tongue. 4 lord make me to know mine
 end, & the measure of my days, what it is; that i may
 know how frail i am. 5 behold, thou hast made
 my days as a handbreadth; & mine age is as noth-
 ing before thee: verily every man at his best state is
 altogether vanity. *selah.* 6 surely every man
 walketh in a vain show: surely they are disquieted
 in vain: he heapeth up riches, & knoweth not who
 shall gather them. 7 & now, lord, what wait i
 for? my hope is in thee. 8 deliver me from all my

Non: 10, i have not repressed my lips, o lord, thou knowest. 10 i have not hid thy righteousness within my heart; i have declared thy faithfulness, & thy salvation: i have not concealed thy loving kindness & thy truth from the great congregation. 11 withhold not thou thy tender mercies from me, o lord: let thy loving kindness & thy truth continually preserve me. 12 for innumerable evils have compassed me about: mine iniquities have taken hold upon me, so that i am not able to look up; they are more than the hairs of my head: therefore my heart faileth me. 13 be pleased, o lord, to deliver me: o lord, make haste to help me. 14 let them be ashamed & confounded together that seek after my soul to destroy it; let them be driven backward & put to shame that wish me evil. 15 let them be desolate for a reward of their shame that say unto me, aha, aha. 16 let all those that seek thee rejoice & be glad in thee: let such as love thy salvation say continually, the lord be magnified. 17 but i am poor & needy; yet the lord thinketh upon me: thou art my help & my deliverer; make no tarrying o my god.

Psalm 41.

1 blessed is he that considereth the poor: the lord will deliver him in time of trouble. 2 the lord will preserve him, & keep him alive; & he shall be blessed upon the earth: & thou wilt not deliver him unto the will of his enemies. 3 the lord will strengthen him upon the bed of languishing: thou wilt make all his bed in sickness. 4 i said, lord, be merciful unto me, heal my soul; for i have sinned against thee. 5 mine enemies speak evil of me, when shall he die,

name of our God, or stretched out our hands to a strange God: 21 shall not God search this out for he knoweth the secrets of the heart. 22 Yea, for thy sake are we killed all the day long; we are counted as sheep for the slaughter. 23 awake, why sleepest thou, o lord? arise, cast us not off for ever. 24 wherefore hidest thou thy face, & forgettest our affliction & our oppression? 25 our soul is bowed down to the dust: our belly cleaveth unto the earth. 26 arise for our help, & redeem us for thy mercies' sake.

Psalm 45.

MY heart is inditing a good matter: i speak of the things which i have made touching the king: my tongue is the pen of a ready writer. 2 thou art fairer than the children of men: grace is poured into thy lips: therefore God hath blessed thee for ever. 3 gird thy sword upon thy thigh, o most mighty, with thy glory & thy majesty. 4 & in thy majesty ride prosperously because of truth & meekness & righteousness; & thy right hand shall teach thee terrible things. 5 thine arrows are sharp in the heart of the king's enemies whereby the people fall under thee. 6 thy throne o God, is for ever & ever: the sceptre of thy kingdom is a right sceptre. 7 thou lovest righteousness, & hatest wickedness: therefore God, thy God, hath anointed thee with the oil of gladness above thy fellows. 8 all thy garments smell of myrrh, & aloes, & cassia, out of the ivory palaces, whereby they have made thee glad. 9 kings' daughters were among thy honorable women: upon thy right hand did stand the Queen in gold of ophir. 10 hearken, o daughter, & con-

side, & incline thine ear; forget also thine own People,
 & thy father's house; 11 so shall the king
 greatly desire thy beauty: for he is thy lord, &
 worship thou him. 12 & the daughter of Tyre
 shall be there with a gift; even the rich among the
 People shall entreat thy favor. 13 the king's
 daughter is all glorious within: her clothing is of
 wrought gold. 14 she shall be brought unto the
 king in raiment of needlework; the virgins her com-
 panions that follow her shall be brought unto thee.
 15 with gladness & rejoicing shall they be brought:
 they shall enter into the king's Palace. 16 instead
 of thy fathers shall be thy children, whom thou
 mayest make Princes in all the earth. 17 i will
 make thy name to be remembered in all generations:
 therefore shall the People praise thee for ever & ever.

* Psalm 46.

God is our refuge & strength, a very Present help
 in trouble. 2 therefore will not we fear, though
 the earth be removed, & though the mountains be
 carried into the midst of the sea; 3 though the
 waters thereof roar & be troubled, though the moun-
 tains shake with the swelling thereof. selah. 4
 there is a river, the streams whereof shall make glad
 the city of God, the holy Place of the tabernacles of
 the most high. 5 God is in the midst of Her; she
 shall not be moved: God shall help Her; & that right
 early. 6 the heathen raged, the Kingdoms were
 moved: he uttered his voice, the earth melted. 7
 the Lord of hosts is with us: the God of Jacob is our
 refuge. selah. 8 come, behold the works of the
 Lord, what desolations he hath made in the earth.
 9 he breaketh wars to cease unto the end of the earth;

he breaketh the bow, & cutteth the spear in sunder;
 he burneth the chariot in the fire. 10 We still, &
 know that i am god: i will be exalted among the
 heathen, i will be exalted in the earth. 11 The lord
 of hosts is with us; the god of Jacob is our refuge.
 selah.

Psalm 47.

1 clap your hands, all ye people, shout unto god
 with the voice of triumph. 2 for the lord most

 when i cried thou answeredst me, & strengthenedst
 me with strength in my soul. 4 all the kings of the
 earth shall praise thee, o lord, when they hear the
 words of thy mouth. 5 Yea, they shall sing in the
 ways of the lord: for great is the glory of the lord.
 6 though the lord be high, yet hath he respect unto
 the lowly: but the proud he knoweth afar off. 7
 though i walk in the midst of trouble, thou wilt re-
 vive me: thou shalt stretch forth thy hand against

the wrath of mine enemies, & thy right hand shall save me. 8 the lord will perfect that which concerneth me: thy mercy, o lord, endureth for ever: forsake not the works of thine own hands.

o lord thou hast searched me, & known me. 2 thou knowest my down-sitting & mine uprising, thou understandest my thoughts afar off. 3 thou compassest my path & my lying down, & art acquainted with all my ways. 4 for there is not a word in my tongue, but lo, o lord, thou knowest it altogether. 5 thou hast beset me behind & before, & laid thy hand upon me. 6 such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is high i cannot attain unto it. 7 whither shall i go from thy spirit? or whither shall i flee from thy presence? 8 if i ascend up into heaven, thou art there: if i make my bed in hell, behold, thou art there. 9 if i take the wings of the morning, & dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea; 10 even there shall thy hand lead me, & thy right hand shall hold me. 11 if i say, surely the darkness shall cover me; even the night shall be light about me. 12 Yea, the darkness hideth not from thee; but the light shineth as the day: the darkness & the light are both alike to thee. 13 for thou hast possessed my reins: thou hast covered me in my mother's womb. 14 i will praise thee; for i am fearfully & wonderfully made: marvellous are thy works; & that my soul knoweth right well. 15 my substance was not hid from thee, when i was made in secret, & curiously wrought in the lowest parts of the earth. 16 thine eyes did see my substance, yet being imperfect; & in thy book all my

members were written, which in continuance were fashioned, when as yet there was none of them. 17 how Precious also are thy thoughts unto me, o lord! how great is the sum of them! 18 if i should count them, they are more in number than the sand: when i awake, i am still with thee. 19 surely thou wilt slay the wicked, o lord: depart from me therefore, Ye bloody men. 20 for they speak against thee wickedly & thine enemies take thy name in vain. 21 do not i hate them, o lord, that hate thee? & am not i grieved with those that rise up against thee? 22 i hate them with perfect hatred; i count them mine enemies. 23 search me, o lord, & know my heart: try me & know my thoughts: 24 & see if there be any wicked way in me, & lead me in the way everlasting.

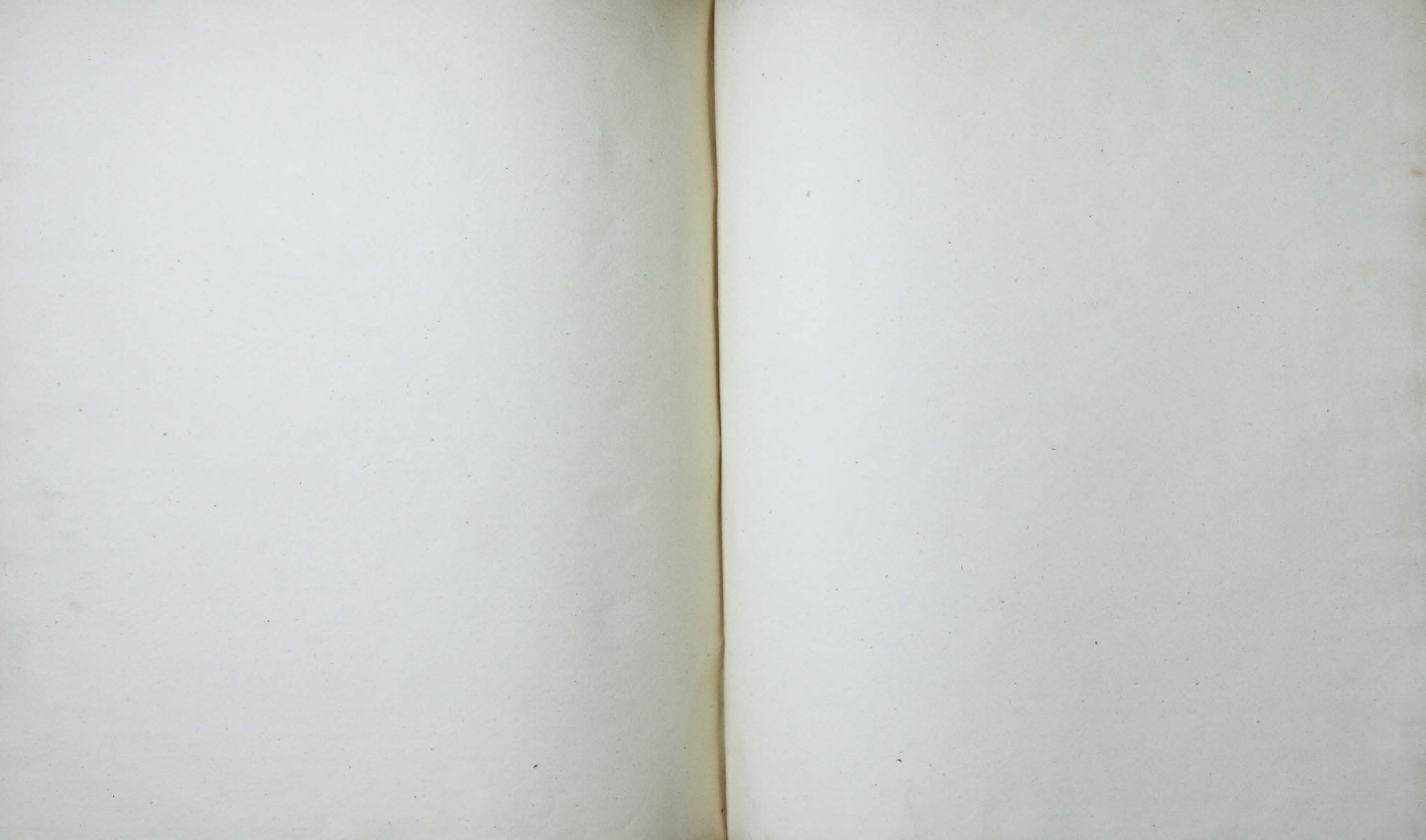
- Psalm 140.

Selah. 4 keep me, o lord, from the hands of the wicked; Preserve me from the violent man; who have Purposed to overthrow my goings. 5 the Proud have hid a snare for me, & cords; they have spread a net by the way side; they have set vns for me. Selah. 6 i said unto the lord, thou art my god: hear the voice of my supplications, o lord. 7 o lord the lord, the strength of my salvation, thou hast covered my head in the day of battle. 8 grant not o lord, the desires of the wicked: further not his wicked device; lest they exalt themselves.  to practice wicked words with men that work in in-
 iquity: & let me not eat of their dainties. 5 let the
 righteous smite me; it shall be a kindness: & let him
 reprove me; it shall be an excellent oil, which shall
 not break my head: for yet my prayer also shall be
 in their calamities. 6 when their judges are over-
 thrown in stony places, they shall hear my words;
 for they are sweet. 7 our bones are scattered on
 the grave's mouth, as when one curreth & cleaveth
 wood upon the earth. 8 but mine eyes are unto
 thee, o god the lord: in thee is my trust; leave not my

 iniquity. 10 let the wicked fall into their own nets,
